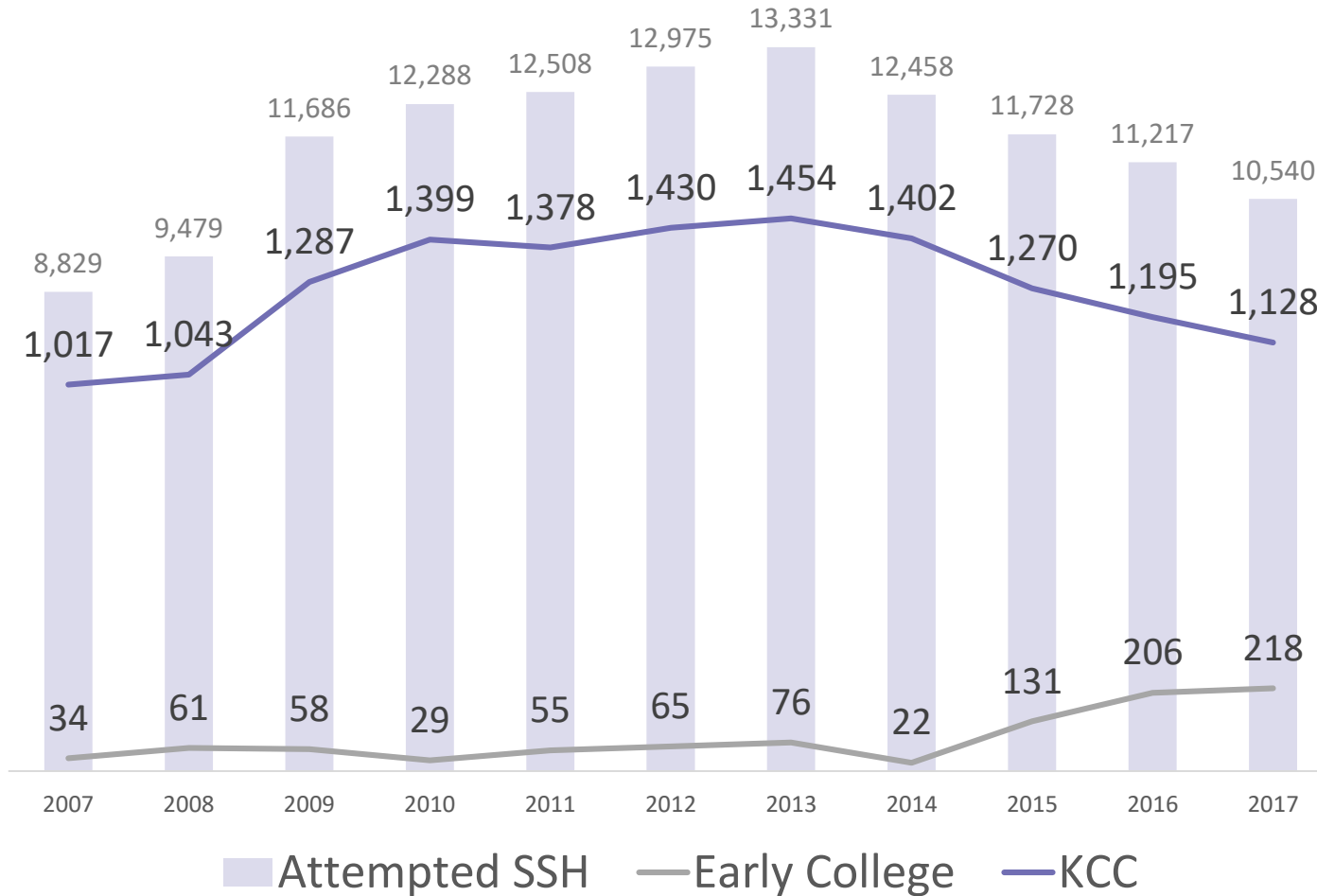

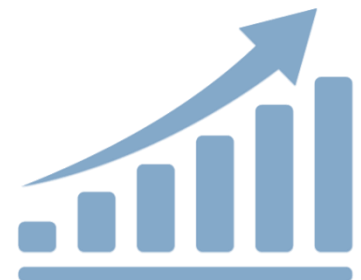
Historical Fall Enrollment



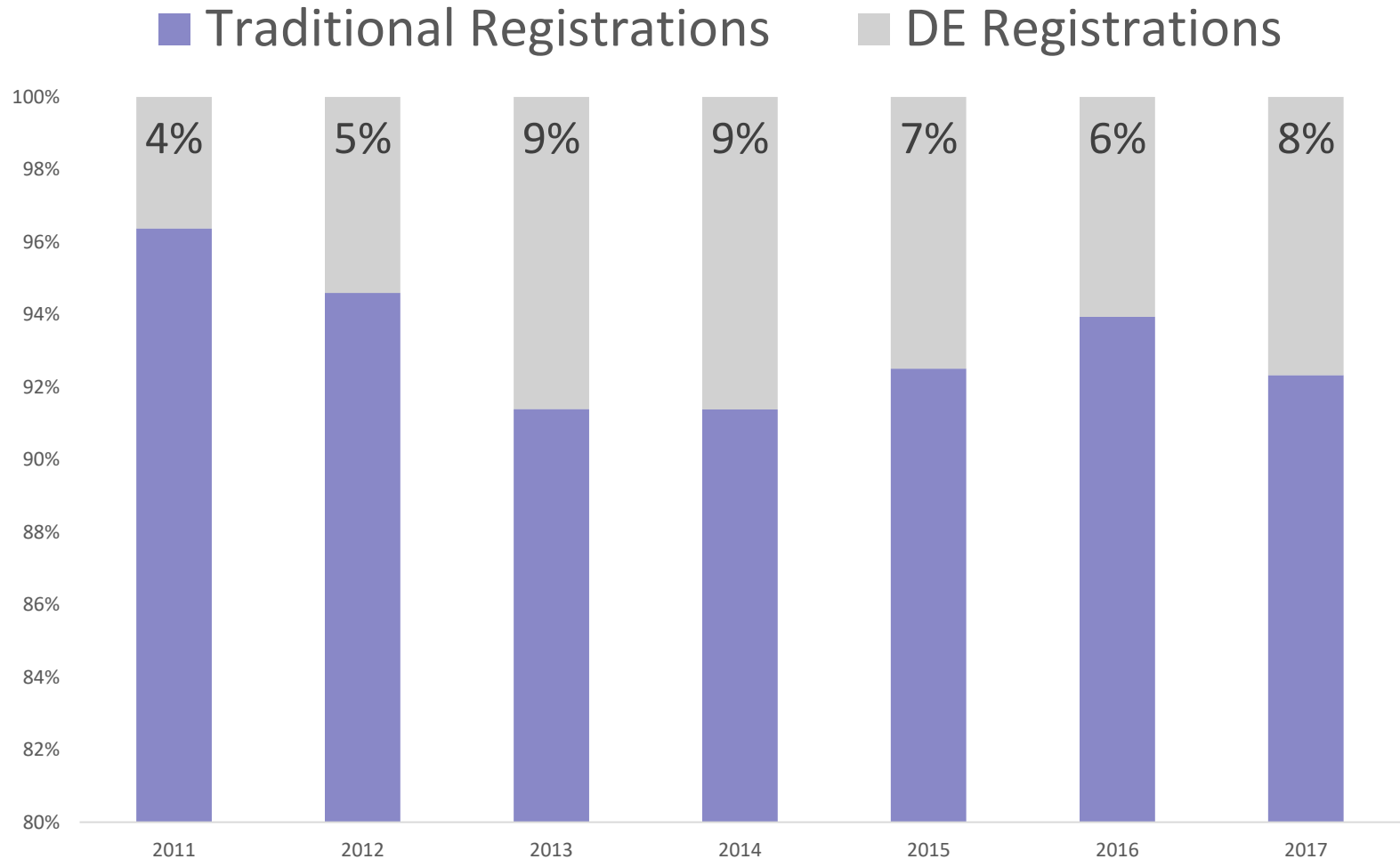

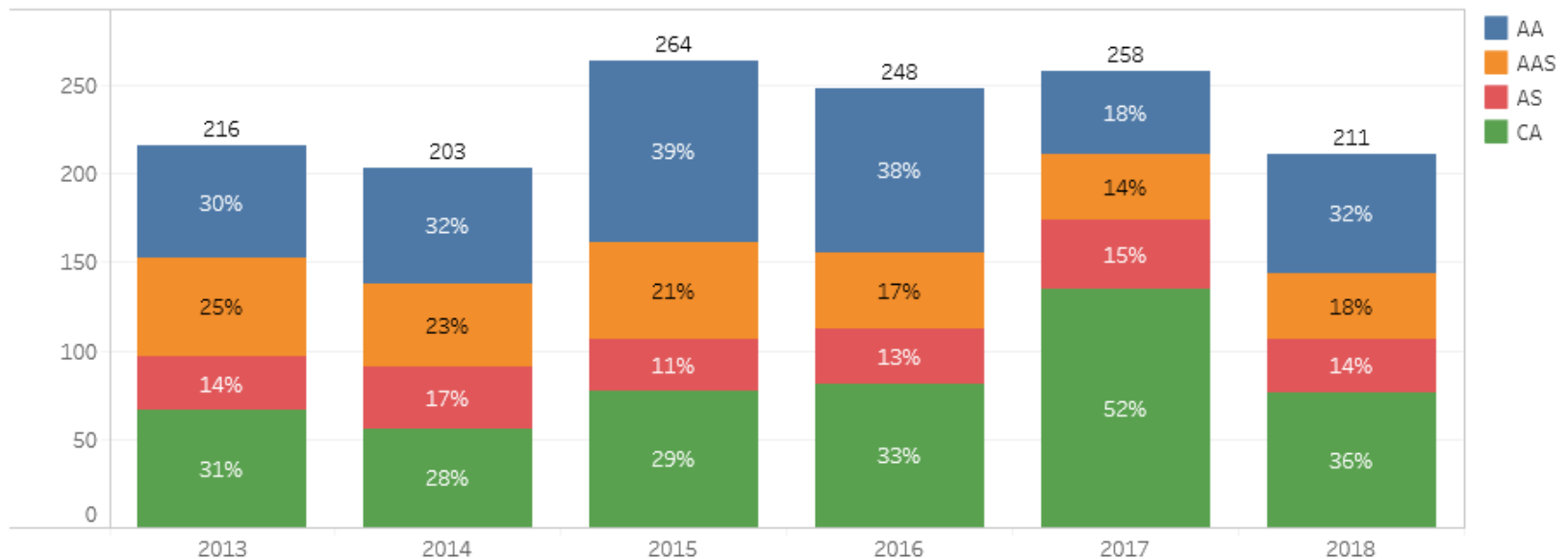
