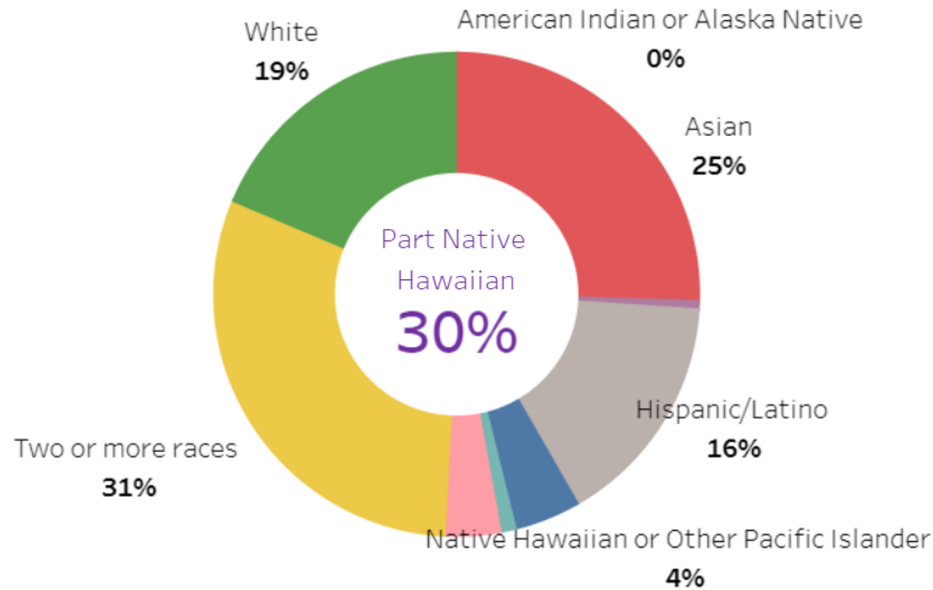

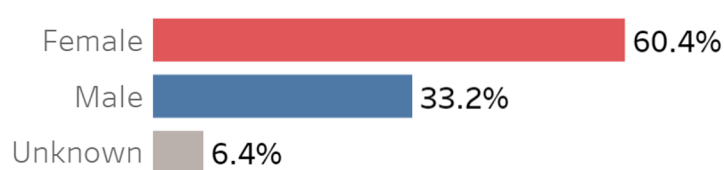

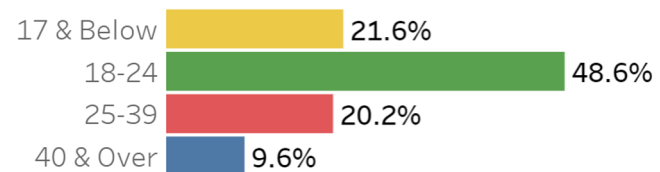
## STUDENT ETHNICITY (IPEDS CATEGORIES)

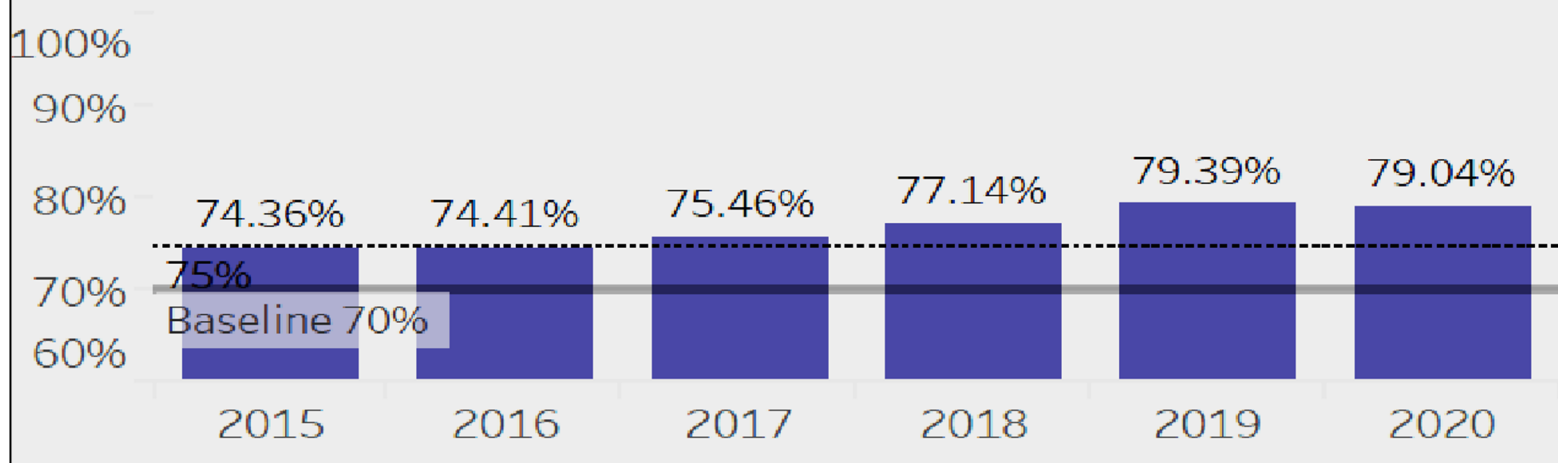
# Course Completion

## Standard 1 - Course Completion

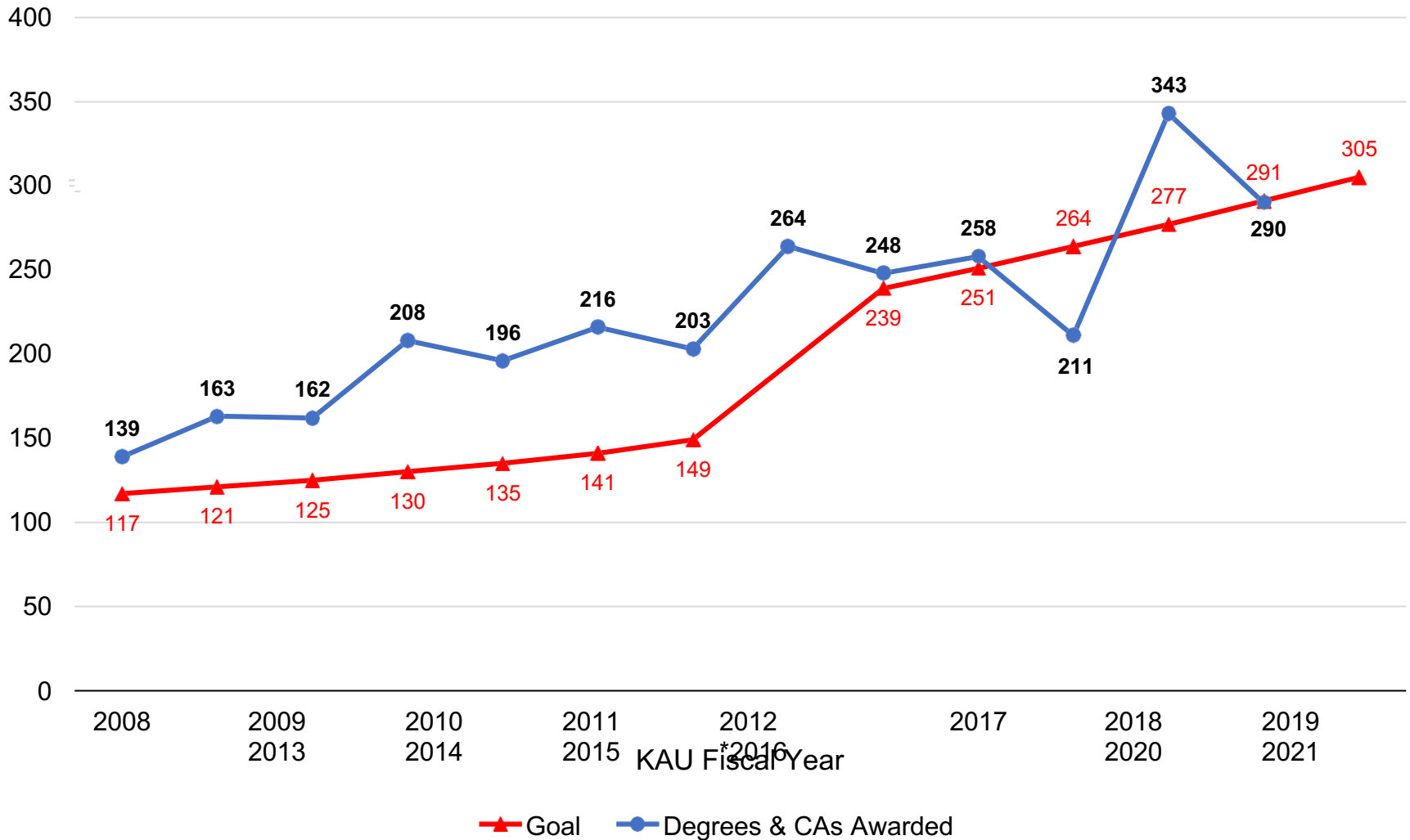
The percentage of students receiving a grade of C or better in a course. The number of students in the course is defined as the number at the end of the official add/drop period.

Baseline Value - 70%

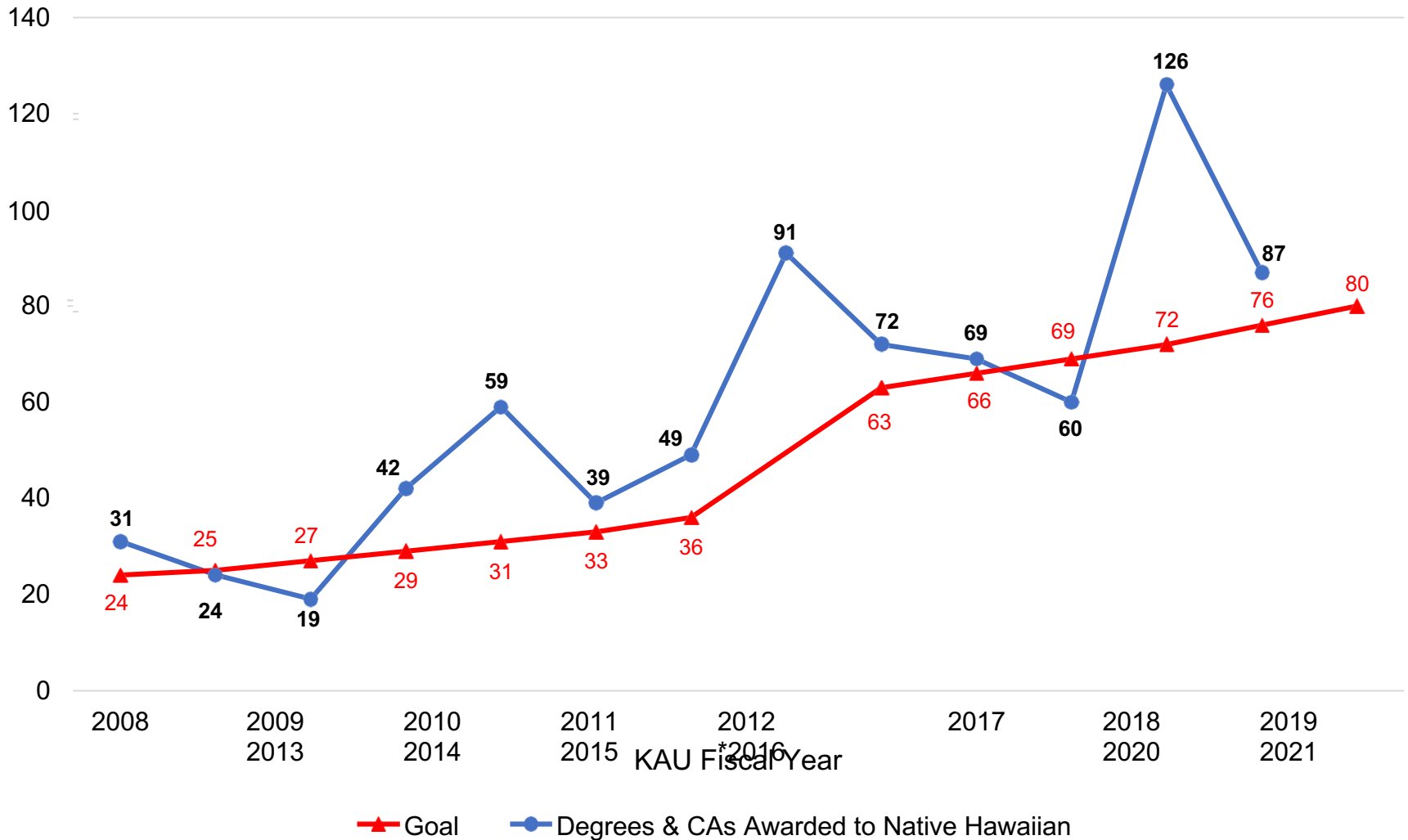
Aspirational Value - 75%



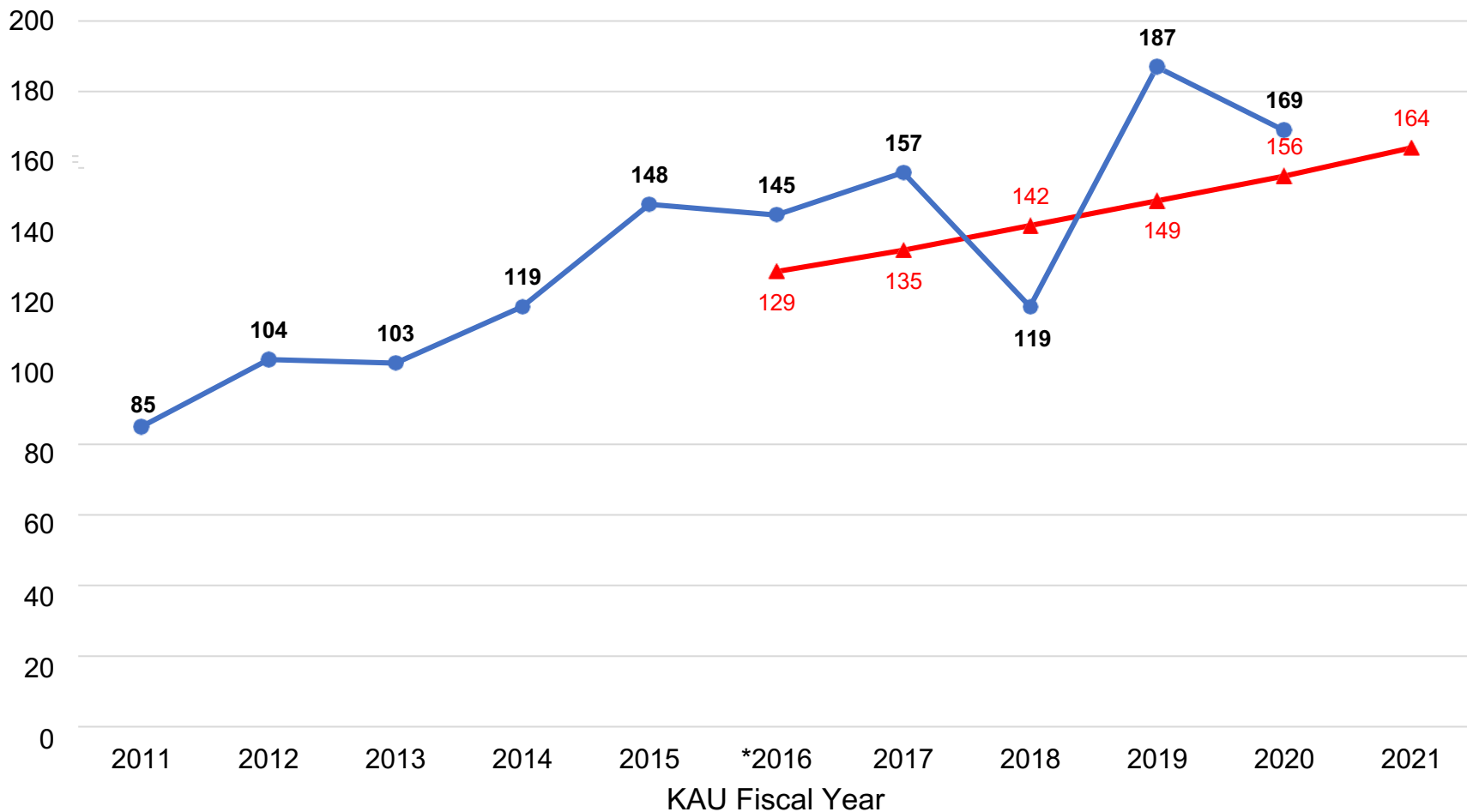
# Graduation Outcomes Degrees and Certificates



# Native Hawaiian Degrees and Certificates

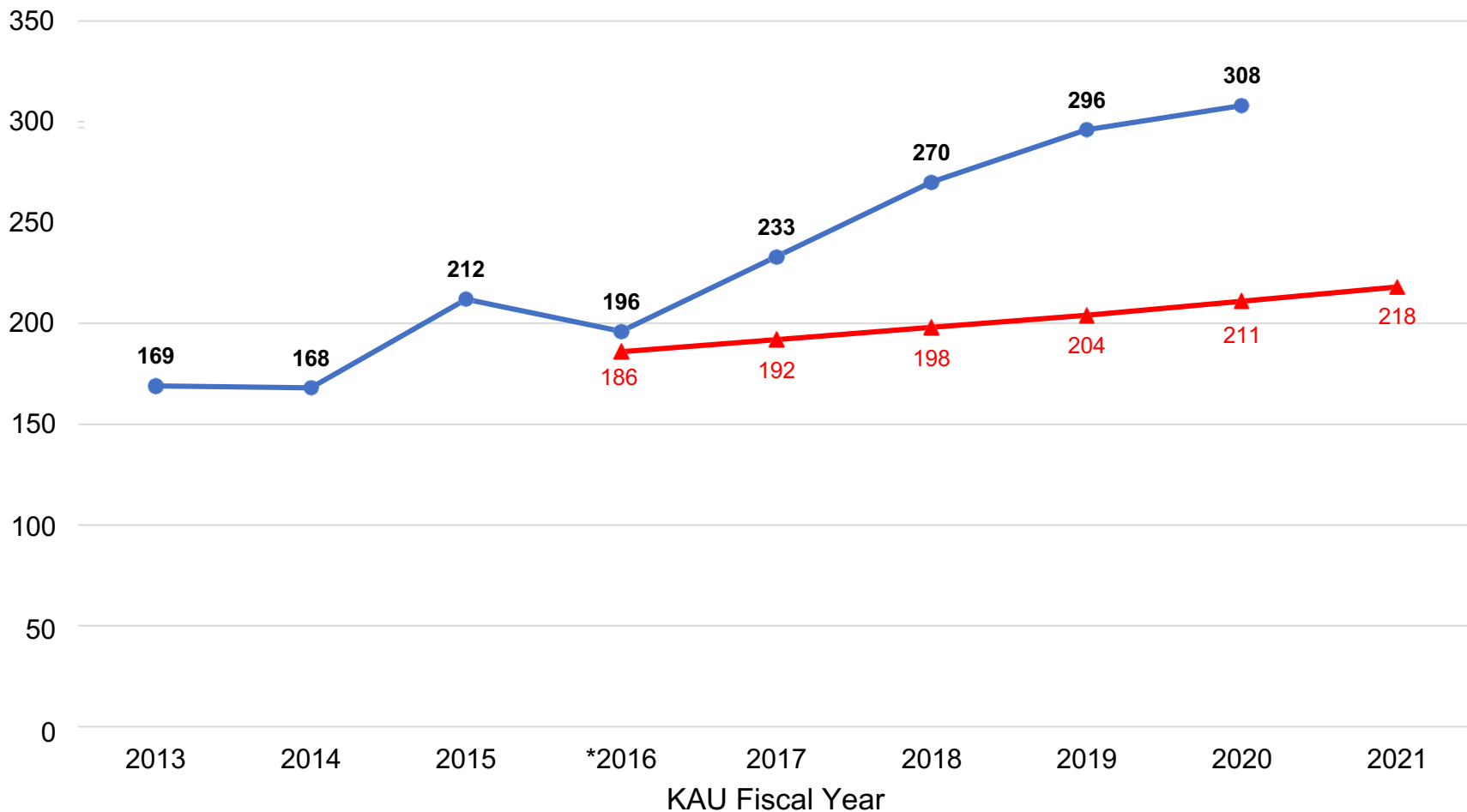


# Pell Recipient Graduates

# CC Transfers to All Baccalaureate Institutions

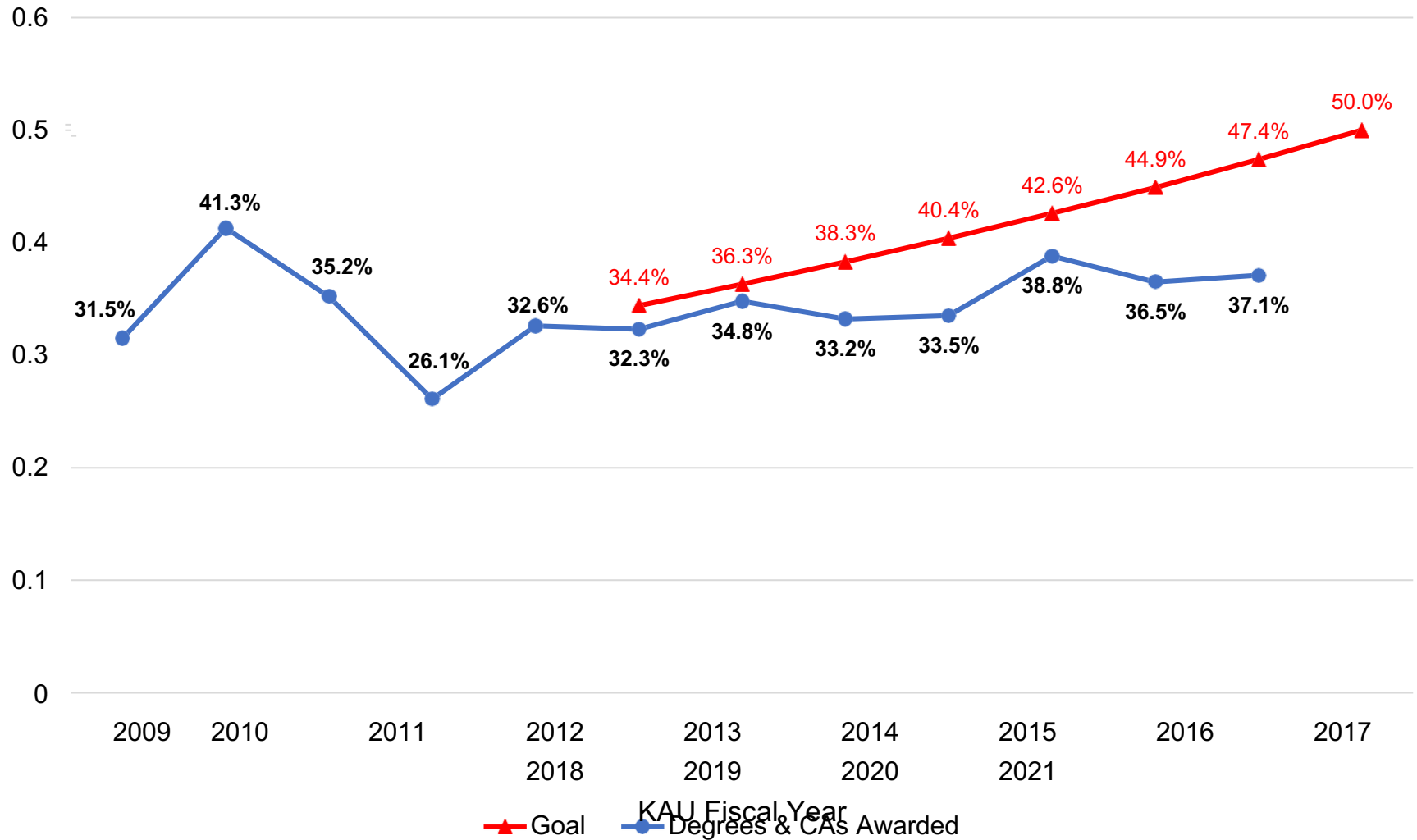


▲ Total Transfers Goal ● Total Transfers

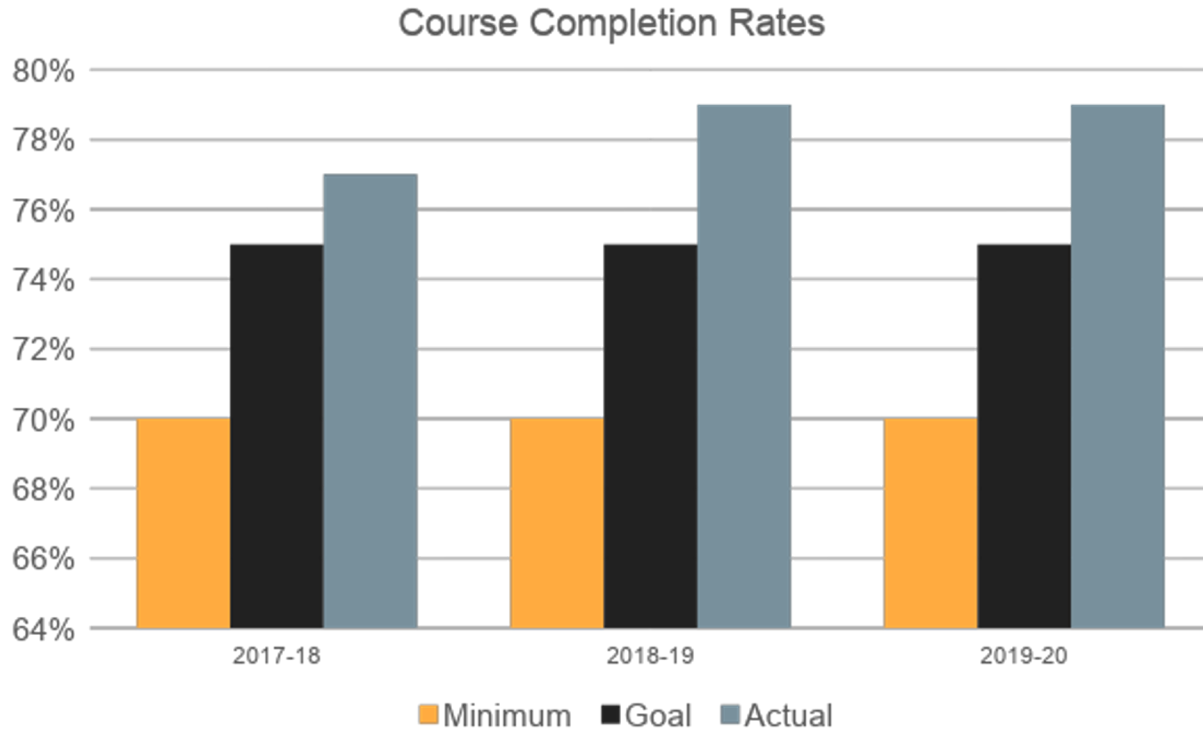


# IPEDS Success Rate First-Time Full-Time

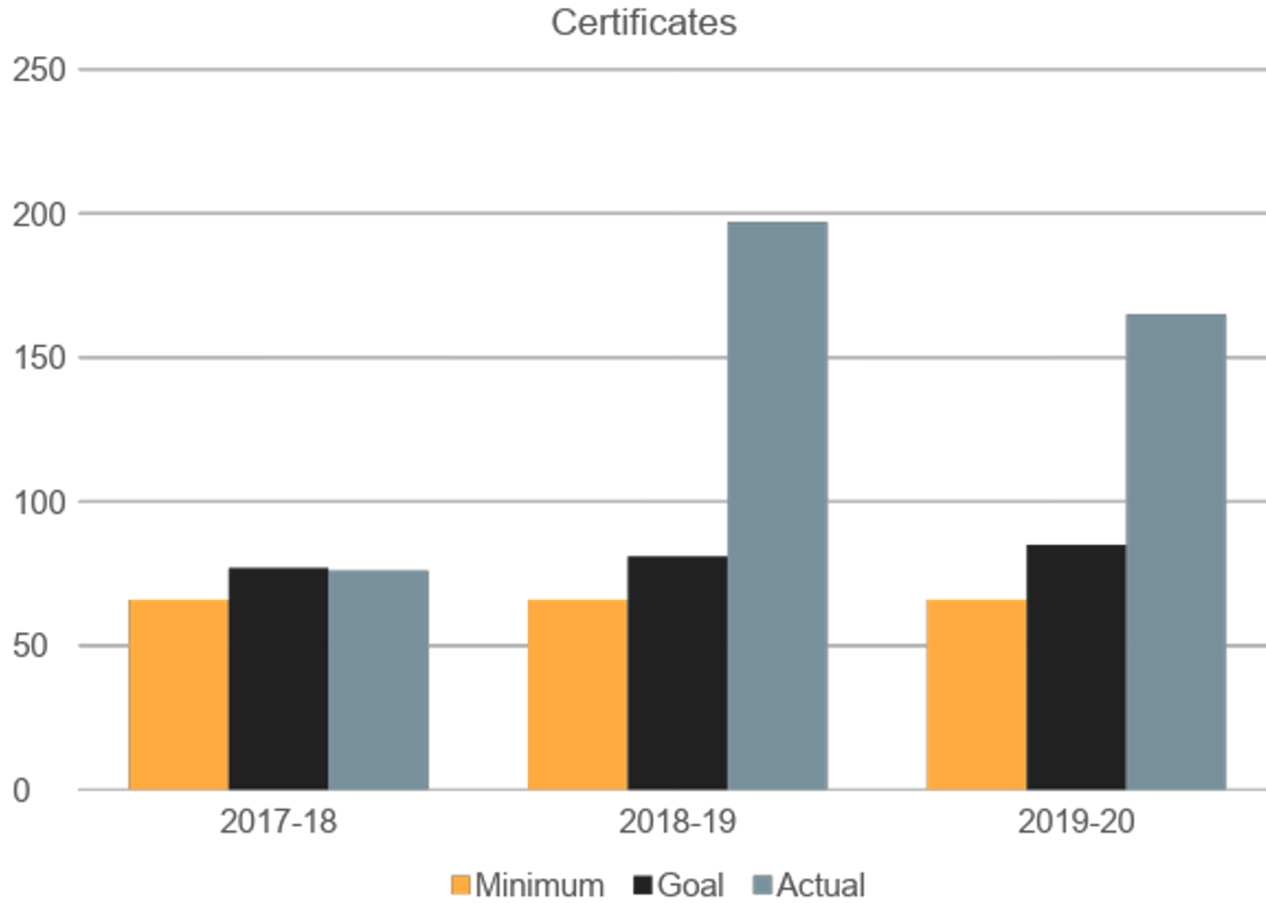


- In preparation of the Mid-Term Report to ACCJC, I will hold a College Conversation in April 2022.
